



Socio-Economic Development Processes And Institutional Transformations In Karshi District (A Case Study Of 2005–2025)

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ABSTRACT	<p>This article provides a comprehensive analysis of the socio-economic and institutional development processes in Karshi District of Kashkadarya region during the period 2005–2025. The study examines the gradual diversification of the regional economy from an agrarian orientation, the development of industrial and service sectors, the modernization of infrastructure, and the institutional reforms implemented in the governance system. It also highlights the impact of state programs carried out within the framework of the “New Uzbekistan” reforms on district development, as well as the importance of the cluster system, digitalization processes, and investment policy. As a result of the study, the transition of Karshi District to a modern multi-sectoral economy is scientifically generalized, and conclusions regarding its future development trends are formulated.</p>

1. Relevance of the Study

At the beginning of the 21st century, ensuring regional development, diversifying local economies, and improving the welfare of the population became one of the priority directions of state policy in the Republic of Uzbekistan. In particular, the comprehensive development of rural areas, modernization of infrastructure, and industrialization processes have played an important role in the country's development. From this perspective, the development history of Karshi District in Kashkadarya region during the first quarter of the 21st century has significant scientific and practical importance. During this period, Karshi District experienced a transition from an agrarian region to a multi-sectoral economy. Alongside agriculture, industry, services, and infrastructure sectors developed rapidly. The

article analyzes these processes based on a systematic and consistent approach and scientifically substantiates their main trends and influencing factors. At the same time, within the framework of local history, studying the development stages of Karshi District is one of the актуал scientific tasks of historical science today.

2. Research Methodology

This article is based on a comprehensive and systematic approach to studying the history of Karshi District from 2005 to 2025. The research methodology relies on the principles of historicity, objectivity, and scientific rigor, and is aimed at consistently analyzing the main stages of regional development.

3. Research Results

Since the beginning of the 21st century, accelerating regional development, diversifying

the economy, and improving the welfare of the population have become priority areas of state policy in Uzbekistan. In particular, the comprehensive development of rural areas, deepening industrialization, and modernization of infrastructure have emerged as key factors of national development. From this perspective, the scientific analysis of socio-economic development processes in Karshi District is highly relevant. In recent years, this region has been characterized by a gradual transition from an agrarian orientation to a multi-sectoral economy, the development of industry and services, and the deepening of institutional reforms. The first decade of the 21st century can be evaluated as a relatively stable period in the socio-economic development of Karshi District, although transformation processes were ongoing. During this period, the economy largely relied on the agrarian sector, and agriculture served as the main driver of economic growth. Cotton and grain production remained priority sectors, while diversification processes gradually intensified. During this period, farms became the main subject of the economic system. Land use was transferred to a contractual basis, elevating relations between the state and farmers to a new level. Strengthening the land lease system, expanding independent decision-making opportunities, and increasing state support contributed to improving the efficiency of the agrarian sector. At the same time, measures to improve irrigation and land reclamation systems played an important role in ensuring agricultural sustainability. Between 2005 and 2013, the importance of small business and private entrepreneurship in the district economy increased significantly. The service sector expanded, and trade, transport, and household services became key areas of economic activity. Industry developed mainly through small and medium-sized enterprises specializing in the processing of agricultural products. This ensured the transition from a mono-sectoral to a multi-sectoral economic structure.

In the social sphere, employment remained predominantly in the agrarian sector, but the share of services and construction gradually increased. Seasonal and migration-based

employment intensified, influencing demographic and economic processes. The gradual modernization of education and healthcare infrastructure contributed to the development of human capital.

Institutionally, the local governance system improved, cooperation between various structures strengthened, and an effective management model was formed. Mechanisms for efficient use of budget funds were also introduced.

In the infrastructure sector, road and transport networks were modernized, and rural areas were integrated into central infrastructure systems. Irrigation systems were upgraded, increasing water use efficiency, while the expansion of energy and gas supply ensured economic stability.

Industrial Development (Textile Project) The Resolution No. 305 of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated October 31, 2014, "On measures to establish modern textile production in Karshi District of Kashkadarya region," is an important document aimed at modernizing the textile industry, developing high-tech production, and increasing export potential through attracting foreign investment [1].

Based on this document, comprehensive measures were defined to establish a modern textile enterprise in Karshi District. An investment agreement was signed on October 17, 2014, between the Ministry of Foreign Economic Relations, Investments and Trade and "LT Textile Cooperatief U.A." The project provides for the construction of a textile enterprise on 30 hectares [1].

The company committed to investing at least USD 55 million during 2015–2016. Of this amount, USD 17 million is financed from its own funds and USD 38 million through foreign loans without state guarantees. This approach ensures implementation based on market principles and reduces the financial burden on the state. The project includes the creation of modern, energy-efficient production facilities and a service center for textile equipment. It ensures continuity and efficiency of production processes. The enterprise was planned to be launched in November 2016, with processing of

20,000 tons of cotton fiber and production of 15,000 tons of yarn annually, with at least 80% exported [1].

The project was expected to create 700 jobs. Additional investments were planned in 2017–2018 to expand production and deepen value chains. Monitoring mechanisms were established to ensure implementation [2].

Overall, this document serves as an important institutional mechanism for increasing competitiveness of the national economy. Cultural Heritage Management The Resolution No. 117 (March 3, 2021) established the Directorate for Management and Improvement of the Abu Muin Nasafi Complex [2].

This improved centralized management, preservation, and development of cultural heritage. The Directorate conducts both landscaping and educational activities, including research and promotion of Abu Muin Nasafi's legacy, organization of public educational events, and maintenance of the territories. Recent Development Measures (2024–2025) [3].

Key measures include: Laser leveling of 29,300 hectares of irrigated land. Employment targets: 39,467 (2024) and 45,766 (2025) [3]. Strengthening investment and entrepreneurship infrastructure modernization budget reforms and water resource management improvements were also implemented to ensure transparency and sustainability.

4. Conclusion

Between 2005 and 2025, Karshi District transitioned from an agrarian economy to a diversified multi-sectoral system. This transformation was driven by state reforms, improvements in the investment climate, and infrastructure modernization

While the agrarian sector dominated in 2005–2016, industrial and service sectors developed after 2017. During 2019–2025, the digital economy was introduced, forming a new stage of development [4].

As a result, an effective institutional governance system and a sustainable development model based on economic growth and social stability were established.
