Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated June 30, 2017 "On measures to rapidly develop the tourism potential of Samarkand city and Samarkand region in 2017-2019" As a result of large-scale reforms, today more than 7,000 rare historical monuments, shrines and unique architectural monuments have been identified in our country.

It is one of such auspicious shrines "Khoia mazgil ota" in "Khoja Mazgil" district, Bulung'ur district, Samarkand region. The history of this shrine is Imam al-Muttagin Abu Muzahim Vazoriy goes back to the scholar of figh and hadith. In the territory of the current Bulung'ur district he was born in 819 in the ancient Vazor region and died in 883. In this country one of the greatest scholars who spread the first Islam. "Khoja Mazgil Ota" is located 70 km away from Samarkand city in Bulungur district "Khoja Mazgil" MFY in the south-east of ancient Samarkand at the western foot of the Turkestan ridge and 35 km. Bulungur district, east of Kildon village, in "Khoja Mazgil" area. The grave of the saint is located on the top of the hill, where a concrete staircase leads. The object of appreciation is the saint's grave, a source of underground water at the foot of the hill in the courtyard of the mosque, and a mulberry tree. This place is very famous and respected among local people. Many legends tell about the real healing power of this land. It was believed and believed that visiting the holy place helps to cure various diseases and get rid of infertility. At the entrance to the territory, on the left side, there is a mosque and next to it is a sacred mulberry tree, which, according to the old residents, is more than 500 years old.

There is an opinion that you can make a wish come true by touching the trunk of a tree.



According to the legend, a healing spring appeared where the fingers of the saint's right hand touched. And if you look carefully, the water really flows from the place where three fingers touch. A special visit to his grave to do taju-islam went to Imam Sam'ani Vazor and it was done by his "Al "Ansab" book. Imam Sam'ani in his work when he refers to the famous imam simply as "fageh", "muhaddis", "imam", Imam Vazori is called "fazil of Samarkand, famous and great in religion" that he wrote that he was one of the scholars. How great Imam Vazori is means that he is one of the imams. In 2018, the regional government of Samarkand at the request of the management, a working group of scientists was formed, In the process of researching the shrine, the tomb of the Great Imam was discovered as "Khoji mazgil ota" is defined from the region. "Khoji mazgil" is a meaningless term, In the name of Imam Abu Muzahim Vazori The name "Imam Muzakhim" has been called "Muzhim" for a thousand years, then Muzgim. Later, when he settled as "Muzgil", he became "Khoja", "Ota".additions were added, resulting in the term "Khoji Mazgil Ota" comes and grows in the minds of our people. "This is another one of the miracles at the shrine of Father Khoja Mazgil is a healing spring, this spring that seeps out of the rock is our people in the language it is called "Beshpanja". Various rashes and wounds on the body of a person who washes from this spring will heal and disappear. People with stomach disease will recover.

Based on the above, it can be concluded that today Samarkand is becoming more beautiful in every way, its historical appearance and fame are resounding all over the world with its great monuments and unique historical buildings, such as the shrine of "Khoja Mazgil ota".

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
