On the basis of the Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated March 29, 2018 No PP-3630 "On additional measures for the implementation of the program" Prosperous Village "in 2018 in the city of Gagarin, Mirzachul district, Jizzakh region The renovated Uzbek-Kazakh Cultural Center was originally built in 1973 as a club building. From 1982 to 1983, famous and well-known artists such as People's Artist of the USSR Lyudmila Zyikina performed their concerts for the locals in this rural house of culture. Since 1996, the institution has been operating under the name "Kazakh Theater" under the YunusRajabi Musical Drama Theater of Jizzakh region. It was overhauled and continued its

activity under the name "Kazakh musical drama theater-studio named after A.Kulmanov". Although more than a year has



passed since the establishment of the A.Kulmanov Kazakh Musical Drama Theater-Studio, the studio has been operating due to a lack of salaries and maintenance costs, stopped and passed. During this period, the building was neglected and in need of repair. In accordance with the Resolution No PQ-3630 adopted on March 29, 2018 by President Shavkat Miramonovich Mirziyoev within the framework of the "Prosperous Village" program, the building was completely renovated and renamed the "Uzbek-Kazakh



Cultural Center". For the complete overhaul of the center building, Jizzakh Research LLC has prepared a design estimate for a total of 3,400 million soums, for the repair of the center building, the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Uzbekistan has allocated 300 million soums, 500 million soums were allocated from the budget and 2.400 million soums from sponsors. The building has been completely renovated and equipped with 16 rooms and a 225-seat auditorium with furniture and other necessary items. After the renovation of the building of the center, the Ministry of Culture will organize 15 clubs, ensembles and amateur groups. Fully equipped with applications. At present, the Uzbek-Kazakh Cultural Center, which is modernly renovated and equipped, has a room for spirituality and enlightenment, as well as a small library, which is fully equipped with all the necessary equipment and supplies. The activities of 5 thousand clubs, such as "Rubob", "Dance", "Theater Art", "Guldasta" folklore and "Folk Instruments Ensemble" were also organized.

Also, the main goal of the cultural center is to show friendly relations between the "Uzbek-Kazakh" nationalities living in the Republic of Uzbekistan and further develop the Kazakh national culture, improve the quality of cultural services to the population, satisfy their cultural needs and to ensure the meaningful passage of their free time, to form exemplary programs that incorporate the national values, customs and traditions of creative communities, to preserve and develop folk art and artistic amateur art, various groups. It consists in the establishment of garages, studios, courses, interest clubs, artistic amateur groups and creating favorable conditions for their activity. To achieve this goal, the following tasks of the cultural center are defined:

- to improve the quality of cultural services to the population, to satisfy the cultural needs of the representatives of different nationalities living in our republic and to ensure the meaningful passage of their free time, exemplary programs of creative

- teams that embody national values, customs and traditions forming;
- preservation and development of Kazakh folk art and artistic amateur art, creation of favorable conditions for the organization and operation of artistic and practical creative teams, amateur groups, and systematic enrichment of the creative process;
- attracting local "Uzbek-Kazakh" and children of other nationalities to clubs, organizing courses on learning foreign languages and "speech culture", all genres and directions of folk art, amateur art and wide promotion of intangible cultural heritage and their original state to the next generation;
- organizing spiritual-educational, cultural-public events with figures of literature and art and professional creative groups, holding direct artistic meetings and roundtable discussions with the population, especially young people, with the participation of cultural figures of the countries of the Central Asian region;
- conducting contests, district (city) festivals of folk art and performing arts, identifying talented young people, supporting creative young people;
- organization of public holidays, performances and folk entertainments, "Uzbek-Kazakh" cultural evenings, and provision of services in the socio-cultural sphere in accordance with contracts concluded with legal entities and individuals;
- organization of various circles, studios, courses, amateur clubs, artistic amateur teams in accordance with the plan.

Today, the "Uzbek-Kazakh" cultural center is one of the signs of friendly relations between the Uzbek and Kazakh nationalities living in Uzbekistan. Our national holidays and traditional holidays of the Kazakh nation are constantly held in this building. In particular, all necessary conditions are being created for our multinational people to improve friendly relations between nations, to live in peace
