In particular, the fifth direction of the Action Strategy on the five priority directions of the development of the Republic of Uzbekistan in 2017-2021 is dedicated to security, religious tolerance and inter-ethnic harmony, and this issue is considered as a priority direction of state policy. Means

Based on this, the relevant state bodies and public organizations are conducting large-scale activities aimed at ensuring the right of citizens to freedom of conscience, guaranteed by the Constitution, and strengthening religious tolerance and inter-ethnic harmony.

Currently, 138 national cultural centers, representatives of 16 religious denominations, and 35 friendship societies are operating in Uzbekistan³. In this regard, there is no doubt that the traditions of tolerance, characteristic of our people since time immemorial, play an important role. Today, 2313 religious organizations belonging to these religious denominations operate in Uzbekistan. Of these, 2,122 are Islamic, 174 Christian religious organizations, 8 Jewish, 6 Baha'i communities, 1 Krishna Consciousness Society, 1 Buddhist temple and 1 Bible Society of Uzbekistan. Also, 54 new mosques were built in a short period of time. 17 new non-Islamic religious organizations started their activities.

The composition of the Council for Religious Affairs under the Committee on Religious Affairs has expanded from 9 to 17 members due to the representatives of religious denominations operating in Uzbekistan. Meetings of this council are regularly held twice a year.

It is known that on July 5 of this year, the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan "On Freedom of Conscience and Religious Organizations" was adopted. It should be emphasized that this law serves as a legal basis for ensuring interconfessional harmony, mutual tolerance and solidarity between representatives of different religions and faiths in the society.

The system of religious education in our country has also been radically improved, new

educational institutions and research centers have been established.

Currently, the International Islamic Academy of Uzbekistan, the Tashkent Islamic Institute, the "Mir Arab" higher madrasa, the School of Hadith, 10 secondary specialized Islamic educational institutions, and Orthodox and Protestant seminaries, specializing in the training of mature specialists who have thoroughly mastered secular and religious sciences, operate in our republic. is taking

Center of Islamic Civilization in Uzbekistan, Imam Bukhari in Samarkand, in order to comprehensively study the rich historical, scientific, and spiritual heritage of Islamic science and culture, and most importantly, to deeply reveal the humanitarian essence of Islam, to fight against ignorance with enlightenment. international research center, Imam Termizi international research center in Surkhandarya, Abul Muin Nasafi complex in Kashkadarya were established.

In order to widely demonstrate the potential of Uzbekistan in terms of pilgrimage tourism, extensive cooperation relations with a number of foreign countries have been established. In particular, he is responsible for the religious sphere of countries such as Great Britain, Morocco, Hungary, Saudi Arabia, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, Indonesia, Japan, Turkey, Egypt, Russia, Germany, Spain, USA, Malaysia, India, Pakistan. more than 70 memorandums of cooperation were signed with related ministries and agencies, research centers and educational institutions.

In our republic, all conditions are being created for people of different religions to safely perform all prayers and rituals and celebrate their religious holidays on a large scale. In particular, two Muslim Eid holidays, Christian Easter and Christmas, Jewish Pesach, Purim and Hanukkah are widely celebrated. On these dates, it is a good tradition for the leaders of the confessions to congratulate each other on the holiday.

It is known that every year on November 16 - the International Day of Tolerance, an
