Dostons in world classical literature are distinguished by their wide scope and large size, the social, political, and moral problems they raise, the intensity and sharpness of the plot and dramatism, and the large number of characters. By the 20th century, Uzbek epics had become smaller in size, and lyricism had become stronger. The main virtue was to perceive and truthfully describe the world, reality, and the spiritual world of man, his spiritual experiences (Mirtemir's epic "Surat"). Legends and myths have also actively entered

modern epics. These innovations are clearly visible in the epics of E. Vohidov "Rukhlar isyoni" and A. Oripov "Jannatga yul"'. In modern Uzbek epics, signs of the drama genre (conflict, dialogue), especially elements of epic imagery, have become more active. (E. Vohidov, "Istanbul Tragedy", O. Matjon, "Pakhlavon Mahmud", etc.).
